

LOUIS SALANT DEAD; LAWYER SINCE 1902

Louis Salant, a retired lawyer, died yesterday in Lenox Hill Hospital after a long illness. His age was 78, and he lived at 35 East Eighty-fourth Street.

In 1898 Mr. Salant graduated first in his class at City College, where he then taught Latin for several years. He later graduated from the New York University School of Law.

He began to practice in 1902, specializing in civil law trial work. He formerly was a member of the firm of Aronson & Salant and later, until his illness, of Stein & Salant.

Surviving are his widow, Florence; a son, Richard S. of New Canaan, Conn., a vice president of the Columbia Broadcasting System; a daughter, Mrs. Myron S. Isaacs of White Plains; a brother, Aaron B. Salant of New York; a sister, Mrs. Harriet Winter of New York and Wilton, Conn., and eight grandchildren.
